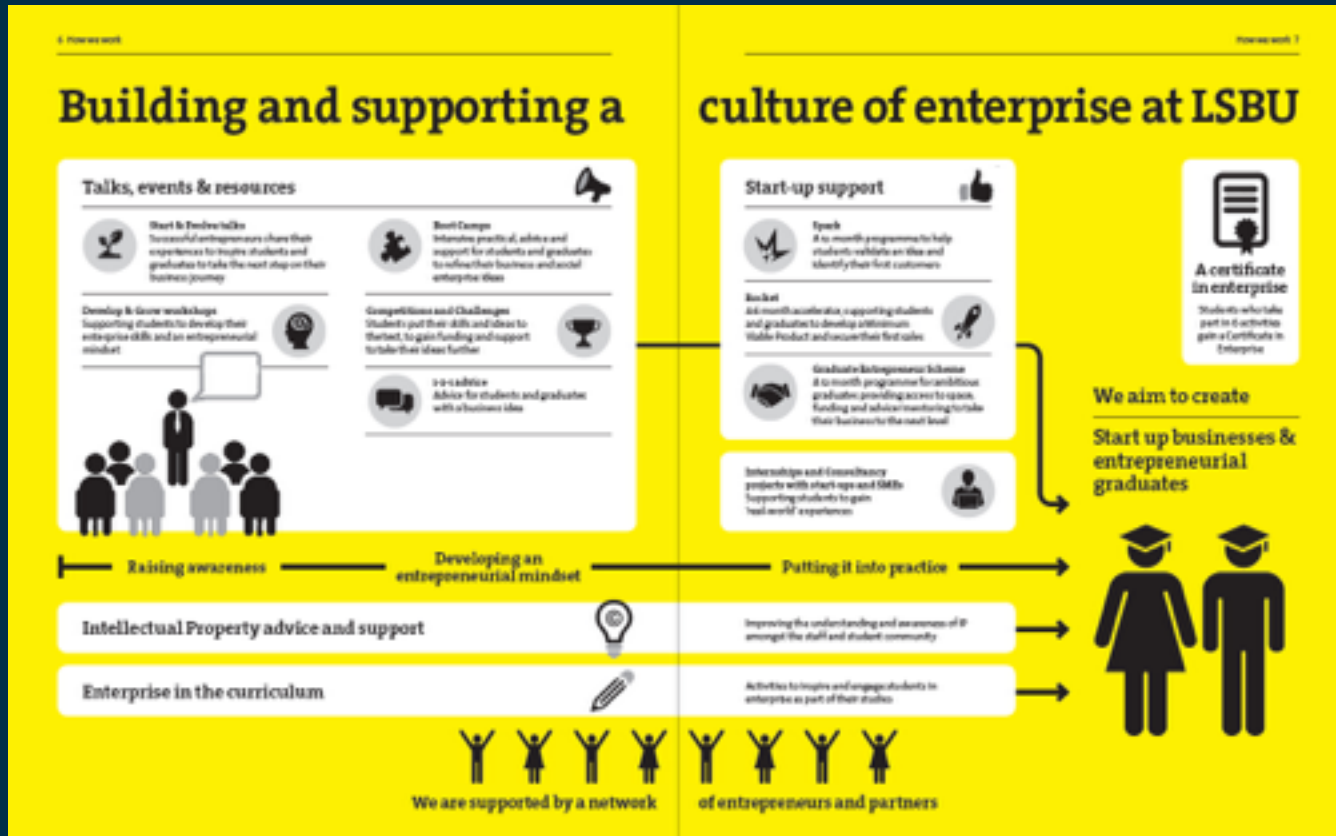

Why was Rocket needed?

- Strategic context
- Intensive start-up support
- Shorter, sharper intervention
- Brings social and commercial entrepreneurs together
- Break down boundaries between HE and start-up community
- We knew we had students who needed this support
- Part of wider ecosystem of institutional and external support: community development at the Clarence Centre
- GES offered seed funding but no equivalent support for current students
- We'd identified the gap in our funnel: fitted in context of what we already did
- Clearly identifiable gap
- Align to University Strategy/focus and investment into the area

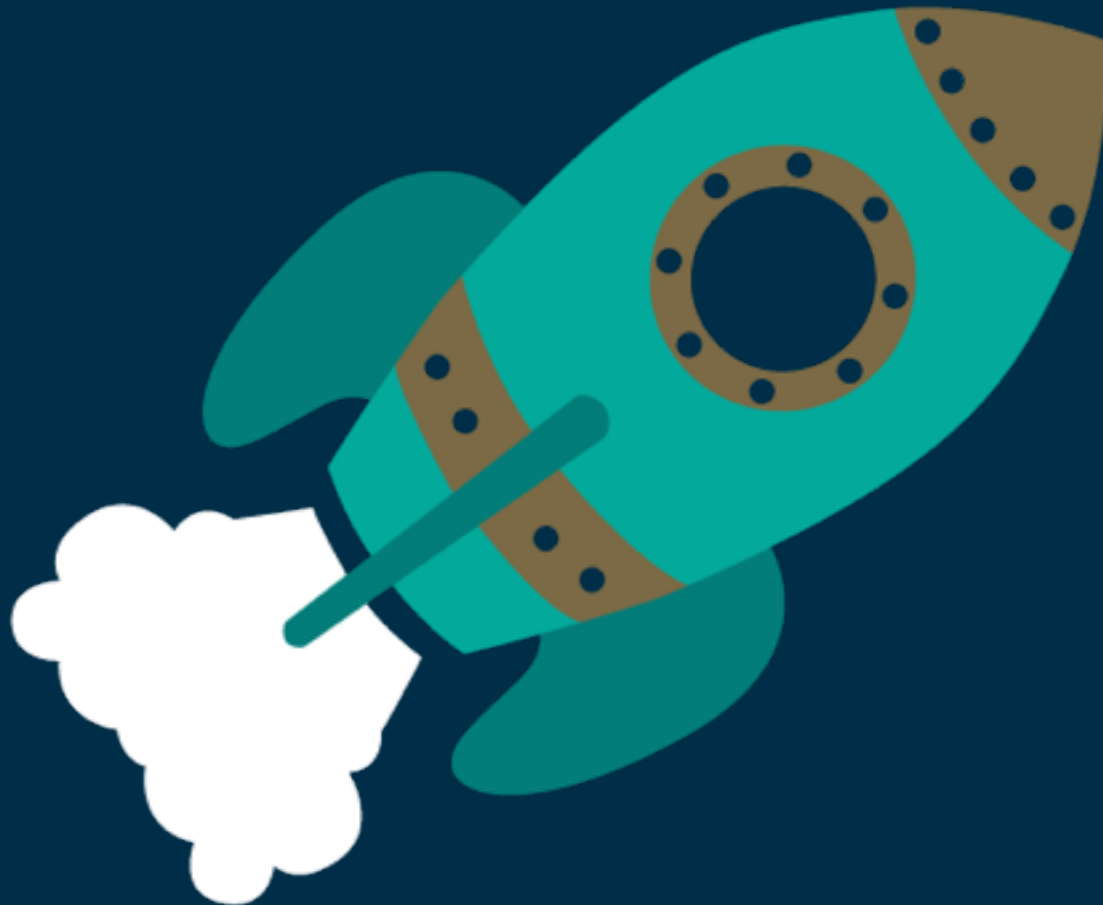

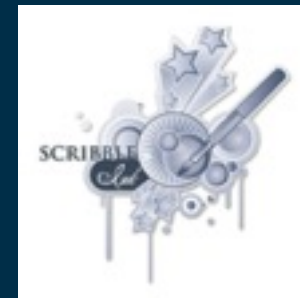
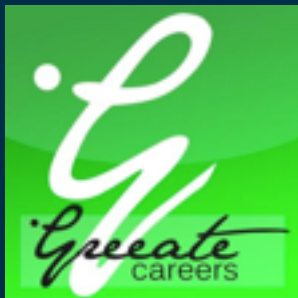
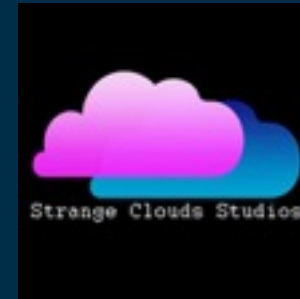
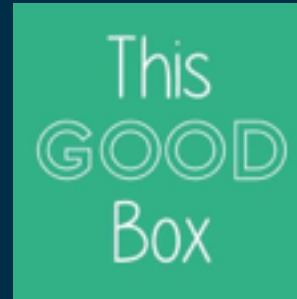
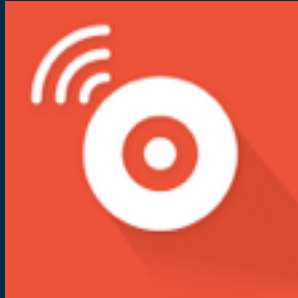
What is Rocket?

- Peer support

- Staged-funding: release when milestones are achieved
- Customer focus, iterative approach, enabled pivots

THE BAD

- “It’s not about ideas. It’s about making ideas happen” – the person and team is key
- Skills support is key: for individual/team AND for business

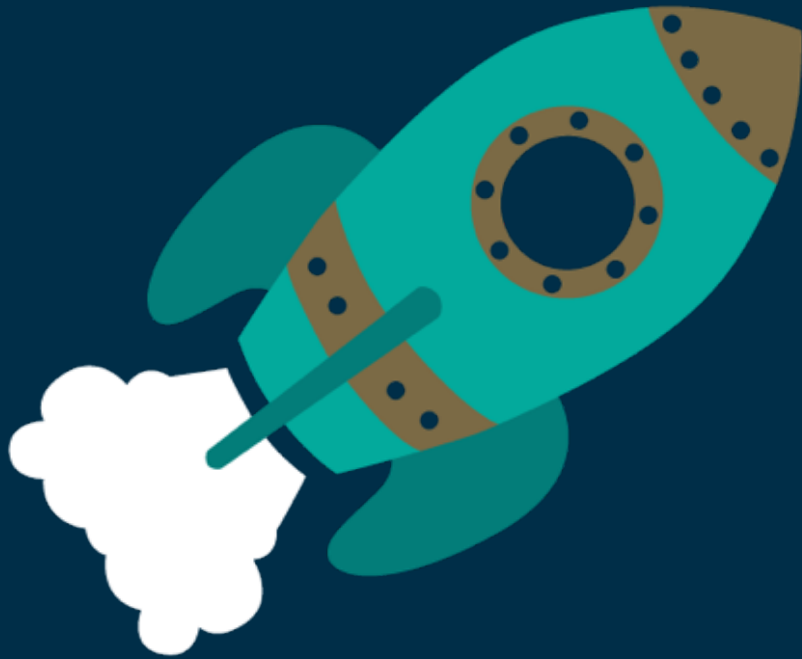
AND THE UGLY
